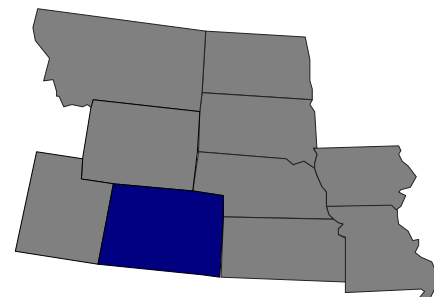


Colorado Community Profile: HIV/AIDS & Hispanics/Latinos
