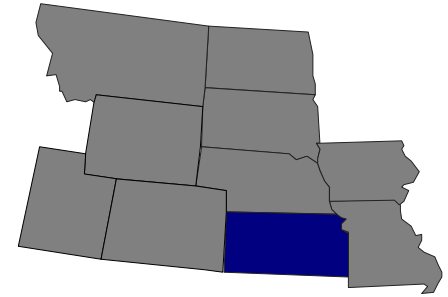


Kansas Community Profile: HIV/AIDS & Hispanics/Latinos

- Nearly a quarter of new HIV and AIDS cases are in women
- Heterosexual transmission accounts for 17% of new HIV cases
